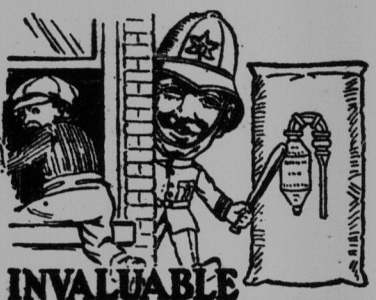

NEW RACE BEING CREATED IN U. S.

Fusing of Racial Groups Affects Government's Foreign Policy.

Toronto, June 23—Albert J. Beveridge from Indiana, ex-senator, explained to the Kiwanis convention why it is that the republic keeps out of the world politics as much as it can. Mr. Beveridge explained that because of the collection of racial groups in the United States, and the difficult task of fusing them into one harmonious and homogeneous people—in short, to create a new race in the world, which shall be known as the "American people"—the Government of the United States could not interfere, politically, with foreign disputes, plans or ambitions. If such were done the welding process among the racial groups would be reversed, he said.

Following up this feature, Mr. Beveridge said: "It is indispensable to a just appraisal of Ameri's foreign policy

that this tremendous circumstance, which is not present in any country of the old world, and which affects no European or Asiatic Government, shall be clearly borne in mind by those who assume to pass judgment upon the motives of the American people and the policies of the American Government.

"From every point of view," said Mr. Beveridge at the outset, "and upon every possible consideration, the relationship between Canada and our republic should be and is more intimate than those of any other two nations on earth. Speaking the same language, having the same standard and manner of living, close connections in trade and commerce, and mingling socially as if of one country, the peoples of these two countries were being drawn even closer by bonds of mutual interest." Mr. Beveridge said Ki-ada were inspired by the spirit of their common motto, "We Build."

upon, and it is a matter of satisfaction to learn from the minister of railways that such a proposal has been made by two of the provincial ministers. The railway certainly is an undertaking of a national character, and as the province cannot afford to bear the loss in connection with it, the case for the assumption of this obligation by the dominion is very strong.

If precedent is desired for such action it can be found in the assuming by the dominion of over \$120,000,000 of railway bond guarantees for the western provinces. Of these \$40,000,000 was in the nature of guarantees given by British Columbia; \$21,000,000 by Alberta; \$28,000,000 by Saskatchewan; \$28,000,000 by Manitoba and \$7,000,000 by Ontario. Anyone of these provinces, because of their great extent and the movement of immigration to them, is better able to carry these obligations than New Brunswick is able to carry the St. John Valley Railway, and it is but just to expect that what was done for them should be done for this province.

AIRPLANE FALLS ON SHIP.
Passengers on Cherbourg Lighter Escape, But Two Others Are Hurt.

Cherbourg, France, June 23—A French naval hydro-airplane, signaling over tugs and lighters which were taking passengers and freight to and from steamers in the harbor, suddenly fell onto the bridge of a large Royal Mail lighter without injuring any of the scores of passengers aboard. Two of the airship crew were injured.
