MAKE SURVEY OF SCHOOLS

Doctors and Nurses For Ontario Work
Are all Appointed - The Staff
Is All Women

(Toronto Globe.)

Arrangements have been completed by
the Department of Education for making
the medical survey of the children at-
tending Ontario schools. The announce-
ment to The Globe yesterday by Hon. Dr. H. J. Cody. The doctors
and nurses who are to carry on this
work have been appointed. Within a
short time an appointment will be made
of a competent practitioner to carry on
the dental survey. The two investiga-
tions will be carried on simultaneously.
It is expected that it will require be-
tween one and two years to complete
the work, at the conclusion of which a
permanent staff will be appointed to
continue the inspection.

The staff which will make the medical
survey is composed of women. It in-
cludes the following, who have already
begun their duties: Dr. Mary McKensie
Smith, of Gravenhurst; Dr. E. P. Sims
of Campbellville; Miss Ethel Campbell
of Ottawa, and Miss E. J. Jamieson of
Toronto.

Medical and dental inspection in the
large cities of the province is an ac-
complished fact. In the rural dis-
tricts, however, it is a great forward
step. Prior to 1913 regulations were
passed by the Department of Education

permitting school medical officers and
nurses to be appointed, but only the
larger centres took advantage of them,
the smaller towns and villages failing to
avail themselves of the opportunity this
offered to supervise the health of the
children.

But while many of the School Boards
in the villages and the rural districts
failed to have an inspection made, many
of the Women's Institutes throughout
the province undertook the work in their
own localities. The Institutes through-
out Ontario have pledged themselves to
assist the department in the survey and
inspection which is now being under-
taken. Patriotic associations have also
agreed to give assistance.

The objects of the investigation is to
secure a survey of the health of the
pupils and an idea of the conditions un-
der which they are educated, and also
to interest the local communities in the
work of protecting the health of the
children to such an extent that they
will be induced to employ locally and
pay the salaries of competent medical
officers.
