REFUGES FROM ITALY ENTHUSE OVER SUCCESS

British and Italian Drive Against Austrians Goes on Well—The Piave Crossed

Italian Headquarters, Monday, Oct. 28.—(By the Associated Press)—People living in the war zone at tonight surrounding the bulletin board upon which is placed the official statement that the Piave River has been crossed and that the battle is still going on. There were many impromptu addresses which were enthusiastically cheered by the civilians. It is evident that the offensive is popular, as it has been warmly desired for many months, especially by the thousands of refugees who were driven from their homes last fall by the advancing Austrians. London, Oct. 28.—Progress toward Odero, on the east side of the Piave River, is indicated in the official statement on operations by British troops in the Italian offensive, issued at the war office tonight. The statement follows: "The attack of the tenth army continued today and is progressing most satisfactorily. On the right the eleventh Italian corps has reached the line of Roncadelle, Ormelie, Trupic, Borgo Bianche and Rai. In the center the fourth British corps is in touch with the Italians in the neighborhood of Rai and has reached the line of Chonoto and Chamian and is one kilometre south of Borgo Milanotti. On the left the eighth Italian corps, which deployed last night in the rear of the fourteenth British corps, has attacked in a northerly direction and is making good progress. "Reports of further captures of guns and men come from all corps." "The battle continued fiercely during last night and today, and is in the course of full development. On the front of the twelfth and eighth armies, in spite of the enemy's very lively opposition, we have maintained and extended our bridgehead. North of the Orlic torrent we gained advantages. "East of Grave di Pappado Polo, the enemy was attacked with extreme violence by the fourteenth British corps and by the tenth Italian corps and has yielded. "Our troops have broken through the enemy's lines, liberated several villages and entered San Lucia di Piave and Vanzolo. They are at the gates of Monfalcone. We have captured prisoners and guns, but the number has not yet been determined. "In Albania our troops are closely pressing the enemy's rear guards. On the morning of Oct. 27 further progress was made in the capture of San Giovanni di Marnano. —BU-VICTORY BONDS—

NEW POTATO WORLD RECORD

Utah Farm Produces 825 Bushels On An Acre

(N. Y. Times.) It has long been a reproach to American farmers that few of them ever produced record crops of potatoes, but that is rapidly changing. In some of the black soils of Hungary, and under intensive cultivation in parts of Germany, crops of 800 and 600 bushels an acre used to be produced, and reports of them stirred the envy of Americans. More recently, since parts of Maine and New Jersey became great potato regions, these European crops have been matched occasionally in good years. Now a new potato country is developing in the west, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, and Washington have thousands of acres devoted to potatoes and the crop appears.

THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF CROP ESTIMATES

has ascertained that the month when the smallest fraction of the year's crop is marketed by farmers is June, and this is 4 per cent. In July the percentage rises to 4.8, and the gain continues to 8.8 per cent in August, to 18.7 per cent in September, and to 23.5 per cent in October, when the maximum is reached. Thereafter the percentage declines to 11.8 in November, 5.9 in December, and to 4.4 each in January and February. In the spring potatoes more freely from farms, and the fraction of the crop that is marketed in March and April is 6.7 per cent, followed by decline to 4.9 per cent in May and 4 per cent in June. Nearly one-fourth of the potato crop is sold by farmers in October and over one-tenth in each of the months of September and November, or nearly one-half in three months in the main harvest season, so that every potato grower is competing with every other potato grower, and must sell his crop or lose it. —BU-VICTORY BONDS—
