



To the Women of St. John:

The Admiralty having accepted the offer to equip a Hospital Ship as a gift from the Women of Canada, the local Chapters of the D. of E. received word on Saturday to proceed with their share of the campaign at once. A large meeting was held yesterday and volunteers, for collecting, accepted to cover practically all the city and surrounding suburbs. The \$100,000 required is to be raised by Thursday next, and a maximum amount of 25 cts. has been set, but any less amount will be gratefully accepted. As the campaign has been organized with such short notice some are bound to be missed, and the collectors will be glad if any such will kindly send their contributions to Mrs. Simeon Jones, 28 Garden St., who will receive all money collected. If those wishing to contribute will have their money ready when the collectors call much unnecessary work will be avoided.




