HOUSING IN WINNIPEG

The Winnipeg Housing and Town Planning Association is evidently a vigorous and progressive organization. At a recent meeting there were present no less than three ex-mayors of the city, and a large number of other leading citizens, who, in the words of Canadian Finance, "are interested in business-like and broad-spirited planning for civic growth and welfare."

Of course Winnipeg is growing with great rapidity, and the demand for more housing accommodation is always acute. Similar conditions, however, though on a smaller scale, will very soon exist in St. John, and there will be need, not merely for the work of a town-planning commission, but of a housing association, or some organization or groups of organizations, which will undertake to meet the demand for houses for working men, to let at a low rental or to be sold on easy terms.

A CLEANER CITY.

The attempt made yesterday to clean up the city was only partially successful. That was not the fault of the civic authorities, or of those public spirited citizens who gave the use of teams and scows to help along the good work. If all the refuse from the back yards had been placed at the edge of the sidewalk, all of it would have been hauled away.

THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS

The entertainment which was given in the assembly hall of the high school last evening was the beginning, we hope, of a wider use of school buildings in this city for the public good. Commissioner Agar, in the course of a brief address, made some observations which are worthy of attention.

Not for years has there been so much criticism of any act of the municipal or civic authorities as of the granting of an option at \$75,000 on the Municipal Home. The expression of public feeling has been so universal and vigorous that the council will now be more anxious to find a way out of the difficulty in which it has placed itself than it was to put through the resolution approving of the option.
