Supervisor J.D. McDougal, on the strength 12 Canadian Auxiliary Services, U.K. attached to 22 Canadian Special Employment Company, having been duly sworn states:-

I am Supervisor J.D. McDougal, on strength 12 Cdn. Aux. Services, U.K. attached to 22 C.S.E.C. I am officer in charge of Canteen operated by Canadian Y.M.C.A. war services at 22 Cdn Spec Emp Coy.

While taking monthly Inventory on Sunday 1 April 1945, it was discovered that a discrepancy existed between a trial count taken on Saturday Mar 31, 1945, by the Cpl. in charge of Canteen and count then obtained. Full inquiry was made into the actual difference and the matter reported to Lt. Lowden, the Orderly Officer of the day.

I have examined the contents of Exhibit "A" and find all of the Items, excluding the shaving cream and one or two items of wearing apparell and Exhibit "B" and its contents, to be identical with Items used by or sold in the Canteen.

During washing dishes (cups) this is carried out behind the counter.

I am D-130038 L/Cpl Donofrio J. on strength of 22 Cdn Spec Emp Coy. On the first of April 1945; I went with Mr. Lowden, to Hut #9 to assist in searching the Men's Kits for articles that had disappeared out of the YMCA Canteen.

There was a barrack box under the accused bed, which I now recognize as Exhibit "A". The accused whom I now recognize as B-88714 Gnr. Campbell, F. said the box did not belong to him but belonged to another man by the name of "Duthie". As there was no one the Unit by that name, we took the box to the Orderly Room, and in the presence of Cpl. Earle (Orderly Room) we broke it open. Inside were many articles including a card board box which I now
