THIRD WITNESS FOR PROSECUTION (cont'd)

- Q. 39 Did you make any attempt to secure it for this case?
- A. 39 No, I didn't know about that.
- Q. 40 Have you compared the document which you produced to the Court with the original?
- A. 40 I have, Sir, since I certified it.
- Q. 41 And you certified it as a true copy?
- A. 41 Yes, Sir.

M.F.C. 800, Certified true copy, in the case of D-502801, Pte. W.D. GORE is read, marked Exhibit "L", signed by the president and attached to the proceedings.

- Q.42 Who is the person referred to in this document?
- A. 42 The accused, Private GORE right here, Sir. (The witness turns towards the accused and points him out to the Court).

Cross-examined by the Defending Officer.

- Q. 43 According to the copy of the M.F.C. 800 there has not been any articles recovered?
- A. 43 No, there are no recoveries at all, Sir.
- Q. 44 Was the kit of the accused picked up at his home address?
- A. 44 Yes, it was.
- Q. 45 Therefore, there must have been some articles recovered?
- A. 45 There are articles recovered.
- Q. 46 Was any effort made around the Depot to keep any articles that were found?
- A. 46 We made an inventory of the kit and the articles were kept at the Q.M. Stores, Sir.
- Q. 47 Suppose some articles of equipment were left at the Depot and turned in to you, would care be taken to identify those articles?
- A. 47 Absolutely.
- Q. 48 And the accused would be given credit for them?
- A. 48 Yes, Sir.

Re-examined by the Prosecutor.

Q. 49 How is the accused given credit for any recoveries?
