Toronto, Nov. 24—Locally Manitobeas are quoted unchanged around 99½ teents for No. 1 although \$1 was obtained last evening. Oats and other grains are steady to easy. Flour exporters have advanced their quotations to \$3.70 seaboard for Ontario millers and at this figure they claim to be unable to fill orders because the Ontario farmer absolutely refuses to release his wheat and the millers output is therefore not of sufficient size to please flour shippers.
