

PROCEEDINGS OF THE
SPECIAL MINISTERIAL SESSION
OF THE
LONDON CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH,

June, 1891.

The SPECIAL MINISTERIAL SESSION—held in accordance with Section V. (page 52) of the new Book of Discipline, in the place appointed for said Conference—commenced in the Methodist Church of Windsor, Ont., on Wednesday, June 3rd, 1891, at 9 a.m. The prayer-meeting began at that hour and closed at 10 a.m.

Rev. J. R. GUNDY, President of Conference, presided.

Rev. W. RIGSBY, Secretary of Conference, and Rev. W. W. EDWARDS, Assistant Secretary, recorded the proceedings.

The following is a digest of the business transacted:—

QUESTION.—What Ministers or Probationers have been transferred to or from this Conference?

The President presented the report of the Transfer Committee, as follows:—

Into the Montreal Conference.—J. H. Murray, probationer, to take effect forthwith.

From the Manitoba Conference.—W. B. Creighton, B.A., probationer, to take effect forthwith.
