Fairford, July 30th 1918.

We the undersigned Chief and Councillors of the Fairford Band of Indians, representing the said Band hereby agree with the Department of Indian Affairs to ^{re}pay the sum of \$ 340.00 which is being advanced for the purchase of a hay press, wire and oil. The said repayment is to be made in four equal annual payments, the first payment to be made not later than the first day of January 1918. The following members of the band are picked to manage the Hay Press, and to see that the payments are made to the Department of Indian Affairs; Chief R. Woodhouse, Councillors H. Le Tandre, Harry Anderson, John Robert Woodhouse, William Woodhouse ^{and} Colin Sanderson, Thos. Store, John Caldwell, Robert McLean, Robert Anderson and Gilbert Cook. These Members of the band are also to have full authority regarding the looking after the hay grounds and to see that all the available hay is cut this season.
