

ed also, that should such Receiver not receive sufficient sums of money from the duties directed to be levied by this Act, to pay the salaries of the Justices of the Peace, Clerks, Peace Officers, Messengers and other expences of the said Offices, as is prescribed by this Act, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person having the administration of the Government in this Province for the time being, shall order the deficiency to be made up and paid to such Receiver by the Receiver General, out of any unappropriated monies in his possession, provided also, that at the end of any year, if there shall be any surplus in the hands of such Receiver, he shall pay the amount of such surplus to the Receiver General of the said Province.

IX. And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that the said Police Magistrates so nominated, as soon as it shall be in their power, shall appoint respectively for each of their Offices, one Messenger and two Peace Officers, whom they are hereby empowered and authorised to swear in, to act as Constables, for preserving the peace and preventing robberies and other felonies, and apprehending offenders against the peace, as well by night as by day, and such Constables so appointed and sworn as aforesaid, shall be under the immediate orders of the said Police Magistrates, shall be bound to obey them in that capacity, and shall have all such powers and authorities, privileges and advantages as any Constable duly appointed now has, or hereafter may have, by virtue of any law or statute now made, or hereafter to be made in the said Province, subject however, to be dismissed by the said Police Magistrates, who shall
