McLean, Hon. James R. (King's, 1st Dist.).

Grandfather, Charles McLean, emigrated from North of Scot. about 1800, lived for a short time at Charlottetown, but finally settled at East Point, 1805. B. at East Point, 9 April, 1842. Ed. in P.E.I. M., 12 Oct., 1870, Mary Armstrong, dau. of Hon. Joseph Wightman, M.L.C. A merchant, and a Notary Public. Has been a Governor of Prince of Wales Coll. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, 1872-73, and sat at the Board of Works and Board of Education. An unsuccessful candidate for King's in Commons, Sept., 1873. First returned to House of Assem., 1869, and continued to represent 1st Dist. of King's until g.e. 1879, when he was defeated. Re-elected at g. e., 1882, 1886, 1890 and 1893. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council, and Commr. of Public Works, 22 April. 1891. A Liveral and a Free Trader.—Souris.

McLaughlan, Hon. Anthony (King's, 2nd Dist.).

Of Irish parentage. B. at Millcore, P.E.I., in March, 1844. Is a farmer. First returned to House of Assem. at g. e., 1893. Is a mem. of the Executive Co. A Liberal.—Peake's Station.

McMillan, Angus (Prince, 5th Dist.).

B. in Argyleshire, Scot., Oct., 1817. Came to P.E.I. in 1834, and was a successful shipbuilder from 1841 to 1885. Was a director, and is now Presdt. of the Summerside Bank. M., 1855, Mary Ross, who d. 1859. Sat in House of Assem. from g. e., 1876, to g. e., 1882, and was a member of the Council in 1878. Reelected at g. e., 1882. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council, and Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, and Commr. Public Lands, 22 April, 1891. A Liberal.—Summerside.

McWilliams, Alfred (Prince, 2nd Dist.).

Of Scotch descent. B. at West Cape, P. E. I., 6 Oct., 1844. Is a farmer, a miller, and a J.P.; was Postmaster of West Cape for 20 years. First returned to House of Assem. in 1893. A Liberal.—West Cape.

PETERS, ARTHUR (King's, 2002 Dist.).

S. of the late Judge Barries. B. at Charlottetown in 1851. Is a Barries Law. First returned to
