Ridout, Esq., of Toronto. Called to the Bar, U.C., Michaelmas Term, 1864. Is a dir. of the Confederation Life Asso, and of the Globe Printing Co-Author of The Insulvent Act of 1864, with notes, forms, etc., (Toronto, 1864;) An Act to amend the Insolvent Act of 1864, urth annotations, Notes of Decisions, etc., (Toronto, 1865.) The White Stone Canoe, (Toronto, 1887.) Has been a frequent contributor to the daily press and periodicals, and is author of several pamphlets. Was sent to British Columbea in 1874 by the Dominion Govt., to arrange terms for the postponement of the construction of the C. P. Railway. First returned to Parlt. at g.e., 1872, for the Co. of Monck, and sat until g.e., 1874. Uusuccessfully contested Centre Toronto at g.e., 1872. Elected by acclamation for present seat 22 Aug., 1884, upon the resignation of the sitting mem. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.-93 Bloor St., Queen's Park, Toronto; Toronto Club; Reform Club; Rideau Club.

## EDWARDS, WILLIAM CAMERON. (Russell.)

S. of the late Wm. Edwards, a native of Portsmouth, Eng., who came to Can. about 1820, and of Martha Ann Cameron, his wife, a native of Fort William, Scot. B. in the Tp. of Clarence, Ont., 1844, and ed. at the Ottawa Grammar Sch. M., Jan., 1885, eld. dau. of William Wilson, 189, of Clarence. Is a lumber manufacturer. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e., 1882. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. The election being declared void, a new election was held 7 May, 1888, when he was re-elected. A Liberal.—Rockland, Ont.

## EISENHAUER, JAMES DANIEL. (Lunenberg.)

Family came from Germany originally. B. at Lunenburg, N.S., 1 Jan., 1832, and ed. at the Academy there. M., 17 Dec., 1859, Miss Mary Ann Begg. Is a West Indian Merchant and the largest exporter of fish from Can. to West Indies. Is Presdt. of the Lunenburg Marine Asso., and Treasurer of N. S. Wood Pulp and Paper Co. Sat in the N. S. Ho. Assem. for three terms in succession, since 1867. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal;
