Returned a mem. for the City of Charlottetown Common and Royalty at g.e. in Aug. 1876; apptd. to the Ex. Council and to the office of Provl. Secy. and Treas. in Sept. of the same year. Resigned both positions in Aug. 1878, and retired from the Govt. with three other Conservative members. A Conservative, who joined the party called "Liberal Conservative" in 1867, and continues to support it.—*Devonport Cottage, Charlottetown Royalty.*

FARQUHARSON, Hon. DONALD. [*Queens Co., 2nd Dist.*]

Returned at g.e. 1876. Apptd. to Ex. Council, Aug. 1878. A Liberal.—*Charlottetown.*

FERGUSON, DONALD. [*Kings, 3rd Dist.*]

Grandfather, with family, emigrated from Blair in Athol, Perthshire, Scot., and settled near Charlottetown in 1807. B. at East River, P.E.I., 7 March 1837. M. 26 March 1873, Elizabeth, dau. of John Scott, Charlottetown. Contested 1st Electoral Division of Queens Co. for Legislative Council, unsuccessfully, in 1873, and same constituency in 1874, and was again defeated for the Fort Augustus District for House of Assembly in 1876. Returned for present seat by acclamation in June 1878, on resignation of sitting mem. Political writer for the *Island Argus* in 1869-70, and Collector of Inland Revenue for Charlottetown for a short time in 1873. A Conservative; one of the earliest advocates of Confederation in P.E.I., and a supporter of the Hon. J. C. Pope's Railway Policy. Opposed to the present Local Administration.—*Charlottetown, P.E.I.*

GAVIN, PETER. (*Prince. 1st Dist.*)

First returned 1878 in room of Edward Hackett, Esq. Elected to House of Commons. A Liberal Conservative.—*Alberton.*

GORDON, Hon. DANIEL. (*Georgetown*)

Returned at g.e. 1876, and apptd. to Ex. Council upon
