"By removing the WUSC chairman from the council and appointing a council member to act as spokesman, we will be accomplishing two goals; (1) the reduction of the size of the council, as recommended by last council, and (2) setting up better lines of communications be-tween the SRC and WUSC

", he said. Before the debate got well under way, a motion was made to postpone discussion until September. One of the reasons put for-

ward as a premiss to this solution was that the council members, two-thirds of whom have never been on the SRC, were not sufficiently aware of the situation.

This motion carried by a vote of 11-9. It is interesting to note that of the nine dissenters, eight were council-lors who have never been on the SRC, and who therefore felt they were qualified to discuss the matter.
