





Tough soccer loop to be under 21 in

If the Ontario Amateur Soccer Development League (OASDL) is as tough as it is made out to be by league organizers, Clarkson coach Geoff Whitehead may now be in the most important part of the 1979 season.

To deal with the tougher competition expected in the league, which is for top under-21 players, Whitehead may have to bring in players from Oshawa and Brantford.

league spokesman Steve Lee expects the new teams to bring a stiffer calibre of play.

"Our league will be the strongest league in Canada at the under 21 level," says Lee. "The calibre of play will improve because teams coming into the league like Guelph and Brantford have most of the good graduating junior players in their areas."

"It is a completely new situation in the league this year," says Whitehead. "I'm going to have to set higher standards."

"Last season I just took 16 or 18 guys in the age category while this season I'm selecting players based on their skill."

The Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga proposes to pass a by-law to stop up part of an allowance for road in the City of Mississauga.

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA BY-LAW NUMBER 163-79.

A By-law to stop up part of a laneway going between lots 257 to 260 and 265 and 266 all according to the plan of the Village of Malton dated 1855 being a subdivision of part of Lot 11, in the Sixth Concession East of Hurontario Street within the City of Mississauga and for the conveying of the said lands to the abutting owners.

THE COUNCIL of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga, pursuant to Clauses C and D of Subsection 1 of Section 443 of The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1970, c. 284, as amended ENACTS as follows:

1. THAT the 12 foot laneway lying between lots 257 to 260 (both inclusive) and lots 265 and 266, all according to a plan of the Village of Malton by J.S. Dennis, P.L.S. dated the 5th. day of October 1855, being a subdivision of part of Lot 11 in the sixth concession East of Hurontario Street TOR-4, being more particularly described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto and forming part of this by-law is hereby stopped up.
2. THAT the soil and freehold of the above stopped up highway be sold to Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada.

SCHEDULE 'A' TO BY-LAW NUMBER 163-79

ALL AND SINGULAR, that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Mississauga, Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly in the Township of Toronto, County of Peel), Province of Ontario, and being composed of part of a 12.0 foot lane lying between Lots 257 to 260, (both inclusive), and Lots 265 and 266 all according to a plan of the Village of Malton by J.S. Dennis, P.L.S. dated 5th. October, 1855, being a subdivision of Part of Lot 11 in the sixth concession East of Hurontario Street and referred to in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Office of Peel (No. 43) as TOR-4, and which said parcel may be described as that part of the said land lying Northwesterly of and adjacent to the following described line: COMMENCING at the most Southerly angle of the said lane where same is intersected by the Easterly limit of Studley Street, plan TOR-4 aforesaid and which said point of commencement may also be described as the most Westerly angle of said Lot 257;

THENCE Northeastly along the Southeastly limit of the said lane being along the Northwesterly limit of said Lots 257, 258, 259 and 260, in all a distance of 154.37 feet more or less to the most Northerly angle of said Lot 260, being the end of the said line.

LOCATION OF LANDS AFFECTED

Lands located north of Derry Road East, and east of Studley Street, City of Mississauga.

The above by-law will be considered by Council at a regular meeting held not sooner than one month after the first publication of this notice and the Council shall hear any person or by his Counsel, Solicitor or agent any person who claims that his land will be prejudicially affected by this By-law who applies to be heard.
