- And Johnson, I suppose you felt the same way about it all the time you were away?
- A No, Sir. My intentions were to return .
- Q When ?
- A As soon as I got my wife settled I was going to return, Sir. After I had my wife settled I would have given myself up.
- Q What do you mean by that ?
- A I just got married this spring, Sir, and there is no other place for my wife to go unless I get her a place to stay and the necessary things to look after her while I was in the Army.
- Q What type of work were you doing when you were married ?
- A I was a motor operator at a mine.
- Q What mine ?
- A Central Patricia, Sir.
- Q Central Patricia Mines at Central Patricia, Ontario ?
- A Yes. Sir.
- Q When were you married ?
- A 7th of May, 1944.
- Q How long had you been working in this mine before you were married ?
- A I hadn't, Sir. Previous to getting married I was working for the Wartime Housing Limited.
- Q Where ?
- A Riding Mountain, Sir.
- Q Riding Mountain, Manitoba ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q How long had you been working there ?
- A November last fall until April in the Spring.
- Q November, 1943, until April, 1944 ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q How about previous to November, 1943. Where had you been working ?
- A I worked on a farm, Sir, threshing.
- Q That is for the harvest ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q What farm -- where ?
- A On a farm at Swan River.
- Q Swan River, Manitoba ?
- A Yes, Sir, and at Dauphin, Manitoba.
