the regulations respecting such, as laid down in the Book of Constitutions, to be strictly adhered to.

XXVI.—Every Brother, on becoming a Member of this Lodge, shall immediately subscribe his name to these By-Laws, as a solemn pledge of his agreeing to conform both to them and the General Laws and regulations of the Grand Lodge.

XXVII.—If at any future time it shall be found requisite to alter or amend any of these By-Laws, or to make any new ones, such alterations or amendments shall be proposed in writing, in open Lodge, and duly seconded, and the same shall be discussed in open Lodge on the next succeeding Lodge night; and when approved of by a majority of the members present, shall be entered in a Minute Book, and annexed to, and taken, and acted upon, as part of these By-Laws

The foregoing Laws have been examined, and appear to be framed in accordance with the General Laws of the Craft.
