The entire offering will be selling in average breeding condition only, and when contending for them in the open market, Canadian breeders will do well to keep in mind that they are the best of two importations, all guaranteed to be breeders and sold subject to the 60day retest guarantee against tuberculosis. In arranging accommodation for visitors on sale day, Messrs. Dryden & Miller have done everything possible to make everyone comfortable. A huge tent will form the sale arena, and a special train has been ordered from Toronto, which will leave for the farm immediately upon the arrival of all important morning trains from west and southern points, returning to Toronto the same evening after the close of the sale.
