Accordingly, Mr. Speaker and the House went up to attend his Excellency, when his Excellency was pleased to give, in His Majesty's name, the Royal Assent to the following public Bills: *viz.*

AN ACT further to continue the Acts therein mentioned for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or inland navigation.

AN ACT further to continue for a limited time, an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for the better preservation of His Majesty's Government, as by Law happily established in this Province."
