The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had gone through the bufinefs to them referred; and had come to feveral Refolutions thereupon, which they had directed him to report to the Houfe, and he afterwards delivered them in at the Clerk's Table, where they were read and are as follows:

, Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of three hundred pounds of the monies granted at former Seffions of the General Affembly for the fupporting and lighting the Light Houfe at the entrance of the Gut of Annapolis, (which Light Houfe has lately been deftroyed by Fire) and remaining undrawn in the Treafury, fhould be applied to build by contract and finish a Light Houfe at such place at the entrance of the Gut of Annapolis aforefaid, as his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the confent of His Majesty's Council, shall direct, to be expended under the direction of a Commissioner or Commissioners to be appointed by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for that purpose.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a fum not exceeding feven hundred pounds, fhould be granted to defray the contingent expences of the Houfe of Affembly, during the prefent Seffion; the fame to be drawn for, by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, on the certificate of the Speaker of the Houfe of Affembly, and not otherwife.

*Refolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee that the fum of fifteen pounds fhould be granted to the Reverend Robert Stanfer, for his fervices as Chaplain to His Majefty's Council and the Houfe of Affembly during the prefent Seffion.

*Refolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of feventeen pounds ten fhillings, fhould be granted to Charles Stewart Powell, for his fervices as Sergeant at Arms, to the Houfe of Affembly, during the prefent Seffion.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of twelve pounds ten shillings should be granted to Israel Conly, for his fervices as Messenger to the House of Assembly during the present Session.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of thirty pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, for extra fervices performed by him in the prefent Session.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of ten pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the Houfe of Affembly, to reimburfe the expense of extra Clerks employed in the fervice of the Houfe, in the prefent Seffion.

The faid Refolutions were read throughout a first and fecond time, and upon the question feverally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing Refolutions to the Council, and defire their concurrence to the fame.

A meffage from the Council by Mr. Cogfwell :

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to four refolutions of this Houfe for granting the following fums, vizt.

1.300 for building a Light House at the Gut of Annapolis.

L.15 for the Chaplein to the Council and Houfe of Affembly.

1.17 10 for the Sergeant at Arms to the House of Astembly.

f.12 10 for the Mellenger of the Houfe of Allembiy.

The Council request a conference, by Committee, on the feveral other Refolutions of this House, for granting monies, now before the Council for concurrence. And then the Messenger, withdrew.

Refolved, That this House doth agree to the conference as requested by the Council, and that the Clerk do acquaint the Council therewith:

Ordered, That Mr. Hutchinfon, Mr. Ritchie, and Mr. Heliburton, do manage the faid conference.
