

The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had gone through the business to them referred; and had come to several Resolutions thereupon, which they had directed him to report to the House, and he afterwards delivered them in at the Clerk's Table, where they were read and are as follows:

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of three hundred pounds of the monies granted at former Sessions of the General Assembly for the supporting and lighting the Light House at the entrance of the Gut of Annapolis, (which Light House has lately been destroyed by Fire) and remaining undrawn in the Treasury, should be applied to build by contract and finish a Light House at such place at the entrance of the Gut of Annapolis aforesaid, as his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the consent of His Majesty's Council, shall direct, to be expended under the direction of a Commissioner or Commissioners to be appointed by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for that purpose.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum not exceeding seven hundred pounds, should be granted to defray the contingent expences of the House of Assembly, during the present Session; the same to be drawn for, by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, on the certificate of the Speaker of the House of Assembly, and not otherwise.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee that the sum of fifteen pounds should be granted to the Reverend Robert Stanfer, for his services as Chaplain to His Majesty's Council and the House of Assembly during the present Session.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of seventeen pounds ten shillings, should be granted to Charles Stewart Powell, for his services as Sergeant at Arms, to the House of Assembly, during the present Session.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings should be granted to Israel Conly, for his services as Messenger to the House of Assembly during the present Session.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of thirty pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, for extra services performed by him in the present Session.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of ten pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, to reimburse the expence of extra Clerks employed in the service of the House, in the present Session.

The said Resolutions were read throughout a first and second time, and upon the question severally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing Resolutions to the Council, and desire their concurrence to the same.

A message from the Council by Mr.^o Cogswell:

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to four resolutions of this House for granting the following sums, vizt.

£300 for building a Light House at the Gut of Annapolis.

£15 for the Chaplain to the Council and House of Assembly.

£17 10 for the Sergeant at Arms to the House of Assembly.

£12 10 for the Messenger of the House of Assembly.

The Council request a conference, by Committee, on the several other Resolutions of this House, for granting monies, now before the Council for concurrence.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Resolved, That this House doth agree to the conference as requested by the Council, and that the Clerk do acquaint the Council therewith.

Ordered, That Mr. Hutchinson, Mr. Ritchie, and Mr. Haliburton, do manage the said conference.
