Mr. Millidge, moved, That the Sheriff of King's-County, should be directed to make a report of his proceedings relating to a scrutiny, held on the Election of Jonathan Crane Esquire, one of the sitting Members for King's County; which being seconded, and put, passed in the affirmative.

The Sheriff, then by Order of the House, delivered in the faid proceedings accordingly, and thereupon,

Ordered, That they do lie on the Table, to be perused by the Members.

A Petition of John Clarke Esquire, was presented by Mr. McMonagle, and read; fetting forth, that the Petitioner was induced, at the request of a number of the Freeholders of Hants County, to offer himself a Candidate at the late General Election to represent the faid County, in General Assembly; that the Petitioner, was opposed in such Election, by William Cotnam Tonge Esquire, the sitting Member for the faid County; who at the close of the Poll, appearing to have a Majority of Twenty six Votes, in his favor, was returned duly elected, on faid Majority; That the Petitioner fince the making of such return, has discovered, that the faid William Cotnam Tonge Esquire, used improper, and illegal measures to procure such Majority, and praying he may be heard by his Counsel, on the Return of the faid William Cotnam Tonge Esquire, for Hants County.

On Motion of Mr. Tonge, ordered, that the Petition do lie on the Table.

On Motion of Mr. M^eMonagle, Refolved, that the Petitioner be heard by himfelf, or Counfel, on Monday next, on the Merits of his Petition, and that the Parties have Notice thereof, accordingly.

Mr. Pyke, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill, to enable the several Counties, to raise Money for the Payment of their Representatives, and the same was read, a first Time.

On Motion, of Mr. M. Monagle, refolved, That the faid Bill be difmiffed, and the fame was difmiffed, accordingly.

A Petition of Matthew Pinnel, was prefented by Mr. Sterns, and read; fetting forth, that the Petitioner is Keeper of the Light House on Sambro Island, for which he is allowed one Hundred Pounds per Annum; that in Consequence of his Allowance, being paid in Treasury Warrants, he has for five Years pass, fuffered a Loss by Discount thereon, of Fisteen Pounds annually, which has caused him to fall in Debt for Provisions, &c. that he is also under the Necessity of hiring a Man, to affist him in his Duty, which, together with the Loss he has suffained as abovementioned, renders his prefent Income, inadequate to the Support of himself, and family; and praying the House will take his Case into Consideration, and allow him the Amount of his Loss by the Discount, on his Warrants, as also augment his Salary; or such other Relief, in the Premiss, as to them may feem meet.

Ordered, That the faid Petition do lie on the Table.

A Message was received from His Majesty's Council, to inform the House, their Committee was ready to meet the Committee of this House, on the subject of a joint Address to His Majesty, in the Council Chamber; and also, that the Council have appointed a Committee, to join the Committee of this House, to examine and report on the public Accounts, to meet at the same Place, on Monday next.

Ordered, That the faid Committees of this House, do attend accordingly.

Mr. Wallace reported from the Committee, the fubject Matter of the Conference with the Committee of the Council, on a joint Addrefs to His Majesty; and alfo delivered in at the Table, an Address, as prepared by the Committee of this House, together, with certain Alterations proposed by the Committee of the Council, to the

fame.
