- "An act for establishing a militia in the province of New-Brunswick, and for regulating the same."
- "An act, in addition to an act, intitled an act, for affeffing, collecting, and levying county rates."
- "An act for regulating marriage and divorce, and for preventing and punishing incest, adultery and fornication, with a suspending clause."
- "An act, in addition to an act, for the better ascertaining and confirming the boundaries of the several counties within this province, and for subdividing them into towns or parishes."
  - "An act for securing the purchasers of mortgaged estates."
- "An act, in addition to an act, for laying out, repairing and amending highways, roads, streets, and for appointing commiffioners, and surveyors of highways, within the several towns and parishes in this province."

After which his Excellency was pleafed to make the follow-ing speech to both houses.

His Excellency's speech.

- "Gentlemen of the Council,
  "And Gentlemen of the Assembly,
- "The business of this session being finished, I take the opportunity of expressing the sense I entertain of your zeal and unanimity, in laying the soundation of civil happiness and prosperity in this new country.
- "Public measures; adopted and pursued; from genuine motives of public spirit, gives us the fairest prospect of success: Thishowever, must in a great degree depend on a faithful and vigorous execution of the laws, to which I shall at all times gladly contribute, by every exertion in my power, and in particular by availing myself of the means you have put into my hands, for the public safety and desence.

General Assembly prorogued.

Then the clerk of the crown, by his Excellency's command, declared the General Affembly prorogued to the second Tuesday in June next, and the same was prorogued accordingly.
