RETURN

To AN ADDRESS from the Honorable the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL to His Excellency the Governor General, dated the 14th inst., praying His Excellency to cause to be laid before the House "A Return of all expenses incurred in the various removals of the Seat of Government, made during the system of alternate Parliaments, such Returns to include not only the cost of removal of the Public Records, Furniture, and Library, and the sums paid for the erection, alteration, repairing and leasing of Public Buildings, together with the cost of fitting up and furnishing of the same; but also, the amounts, if any, which have been paid as compensation for losses, or in the shape of additional salaries to any of the Government Clerks or Officials in consequence of such removals, and also, to embrace the amount, if any, paid by both the branches of the Legislature, for any of the purposes above named, and charged as Contingent Expenses."
