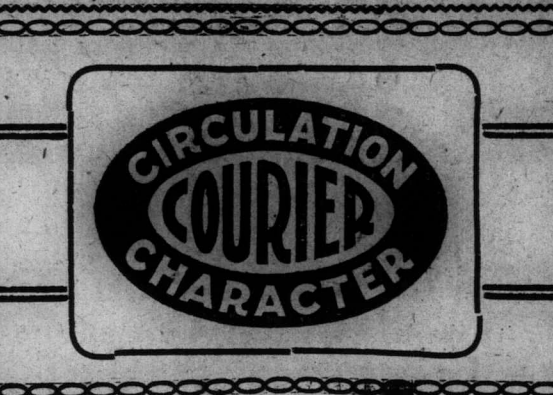

## BUSY WEEK END AT TABERNACLE

**EVANGELISTIC BUILDING WAS THROGGED BY MEN YESTERDAY AFTERNOON**

A tender devotional hour was spent at the Tabernacle on Saturday night when Dr. Hanley led those present in a study of the 23rd, rightly named "The Shepherd Psalm." In the exposition of it he set forth the thoughts of: 1. God as protector. 2. God as provider. 3. God as possessor. 4. God as our paradise.

On Sunday afternoon a magnificent body of 2,500 men from the various factories and shops as well as many men from business houses, offices, etc., listened with breathless attention throughout the entire service. Mr. Walter Carpenter sang "The Lord is My Light," in splendid form, and the Wesley Male Quartette consisting of Messrs. McKinley, McLeod, Mason and Johnstone, sang "God Save the Men." To a thunderous encore, they responded with "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." The Men's chorus of 300 voices, led by Mr. Fisher, featured the singing with "It Pays to Serve Jesus. It Pays Every Day."

Dr. Henderson proved his worth as advocate in a good cause by making a gem of a devotional speech, and the response was most gratifying. Deputations from the various shops were asked to stand, and as they did so were applauded. Rev. L. Brown led in prayer, and Mr. Fisher sang, by request, "Our Mothers' Way." Dr. Hanley's theme was "White Blackbirds." The text of such a great body of men on a speaker was most exciting, but Dr. Hanley was empowered in prayer, and he was indeed a powerful himself in a message strikingly unique and heart searching. Canada's future is fraught with potentialities, and it will be no greater than its manhood; we are in this war to keep our national good name untarnished, and we must fight to do it. Sin must not be allowed, for it weakens and contaminates. Profanity is prevalent, it is foolish, weakening, and lowering. Gambling is a vice, whether at a private bridge whist party, at the race track, or on the stock exchange. Ex-President Taft, the president of the U. S. Red Cross Association, said that no penny of money by gambling or raffling would be allowed to be raised for Red Cross work.
