BOUNDARY EXTENSION BEFORE CITY COUNCIL

Special Committee Appointed at Last Night's Meeting

The city council chamber has been equipped with a number of guaranteed burglar alarms, in the form of sky blue tin cupidoids, which are so placed as to get in the way of every alderman who attempts to leave his chair.

Boundary Extension

The finance committee reported as follows: Your committee having been interviewed by a committee of the Board of Trade urging the immediate necessity for an extension of the limits of the municipality, especially in the direction of Terrace Hill and Eagle Place, report as follows:

1. That your committee approve of the general principle of boundary extension. 2. That your committee recommend the appointment of a special committee consisting of Aldermen Kelly, Chalcraft, Simmons, Baird, and Harp, and that the Board of Education be asked to appoint one of their board to become the sixth member of this special committee.

3. That the Board of Trade be advised that this committee will meet with any accredited representatives of the districts desiring to be annexed and endeavor to arrive at some basis which can be submitted to this council for their consideration.

"This is a big question, and requires careful consideration in every detail," explained Ald. Harp, in submitting the report. The Board of Education, he stated, was greatly interested in the project.

Ald. Clement inquired why Echo Place had not been included in the proposal. Ald. Harp replied that the residents of that district had not

approached the finance committee with any request to be included.

"It is desirable to take into the city all the suburbs that are willing," commented Mayor MacBride, pointing out that the city gave both fire and police protection to the districts outside the city limits.

Board of Works

The board of works reported as follows: That the sum of \$10,698.74 be paid to D. O. Johnson, contractor for local improvement work at Lansdowne Park in accordance with the attached estimate No. 1 of the City Engineer.

"That sewer connection be given at the corner of ... and Goodwin, at the corner of Drant and Oxford Sts., assessment therefore to be made under clause No. 9, of By-Law No 543. The report carried.

The council put in fifteen minutes of discussion on the potato question, means of conveying the potatoes grown at Harley to the local market being considered.

Wesley Jarvis, who had written the Canada Food Board asking for a grocery license, had been informed by that body that he must obtain the approval of the city council. The council, however, couldn't get over its habit of wrangling, and put in ten minutes of the night, when Ald. Baird occupied his seat at the table for the first time since his illness some months ago.

The council adjourned at 11.30.

Ald. Kelly replied in the negative, but objected to one firm's being singled out.

He asked that the words "and other similar cases" be added to the resolution.

"I do not like to make an inference against any man or any firm," explained the Mayor. "When I say anything, I say it openly. I ask for an investigation in this one case, because I believe it to be one requiring action. But I cannot consent to do as Ald. Kelly asks." The motion carried.

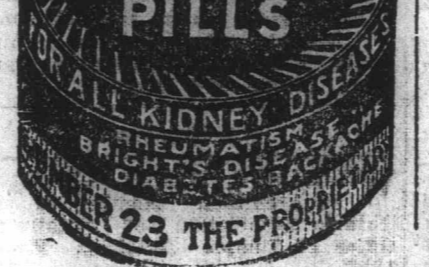
OLD BOYS WON AT HAMILTON ON SATURDAY

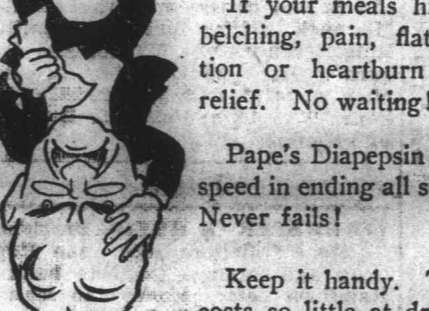
The game was a fair exhibition of rugby. It was clean and full of exciting plays.
