APRIL TERM 1899.
Wednesday 24-Council met 10 o'clock a.m.

All the Councilors present.
The meeting opened with a discussion as to the interpretation to be placed upon the term "Sessions" as found in the by-laws...

Resolved that the minutes of meeting of 23rd inst. be read.
Minutes read and approved.

Resolved that Councillors Dickie, N. J. Lyons and Bishop be a committee to meet the Kentville town council to confer as to a disposition of road money. Passed.

Committee appointed to consider petition for permission to build wharf at Port Williams made by E. R. Bishop and M. P. Wood asked that time to report be extended to January term 1899. Request granted.

Report on road called "Base Line road" (in Ward 14) passing near J. R. King, A. McFadden's and S. Lutz will be shored road. Victoria Harbor, Dunlop's 8124-35, road. Resolved that the proceedings on this road be confirmed. Moved Cook Sec. Rescoe. Passed.

The committee appointed to meet the Councilors of Kentville in re agricultural exhibition report that the Town Council offers on behalf of the town its share (as per assessment roll) of what ever balance may be required of any guarantee made by the County. Report read and adopted.

Report on the road leading from the old post road to Berwick station to connect with post road near Taylor road. Resolved that the proceedings on this road be disallowed. Passed.

Resolved that James Doyle be appointed assessor in Ward C in place of G. E. Forsyth who refuse to act. Passed.

Resolved that Winkworth Wood be relieved of his taxes for 1898 in the amount that he was assessed in Horton. Passed.

Resolved that H. L. Baker Esq. be a Justice to prepare statute labor returns in Ward 12. Passed.

Resolved that petition to reassign road to divide road district No. 1, Ward 9 be referred to committee on roads and bridges to report at January term 1899. Passed.

Resolved that Henry Corbett be appointed assessor for Ward 4 vice W. S. Stoeck. Passed.

Joseph B. Elliott appointed collector in Ward 4 vice C. E. Lawrence removed.

Resolved that Fred Best M. D. be sanitary inspector in Ward 5 in place of J. W. Safford. Passed.

Resolved that Benj. West assessor Ward 11 and the Clerk of the Council be a committee to examine and get from the records an account of the lands in Ward 10 and 11 owned by non-residents. Moved by Coun Mack See by 10th Bares. Passed.

Report of Supervisors in re road at "Washout" received and ordered to be recorded.

Petition of Geo V. Rand and others residents of Washout for extension of road known as College avenue to Chapel St read and resolved, that the petition be referred to committee on roads and bridges to report to this Council at January term 1899 as to propriety of appointing commissioner.

Resolved that the Supervisors be authorized to lease the lands adjoining E. M. Beckwith to him and require him to keep the gate across the road closed to that effect to be inserted in lease. Moved by Coun Dickie See by Coun Steele. Passed.

Resolved in re report of Supervisors concerning road and public grounds at Bon Road Creek. That the bounds found by the Supervisors be recorded and that the same be laid to Barton Bishop be held required to keep up a gate and that a clause to that effect be inserted in the lease. Passed.

Resolved that Lewis P. Dennison be assessor in Ward 9 vice J. N. Felt, resigned, and Henry Smith surveyor of highways in district No 12, Ward 9 vice Jos. Allen resigned. Carried.

Report on road from Cox corner Upper Dyke Village to Gibson road referred back to committee to comply with the law.

Resolved that the sub-committee on lunatics be required to report to tomorrow morning. Passed.

Resolved that the County of Kings hold a County agricultural exhibition in connection with the counties of Hants and Annapolis. That the County guarantee a prize list of two thousand five hundred dollars and appoint a committee to conduct the exhibition consisting of three members of Council, three representing agricultural societies in Kings, one from town of Kentville and one from the fruit growers' association provided the P.G. association contribute the grant available towards the prize list to be devoted to premiums on fruit, and that the municipalities of Hants be asked to appoint a member of committee from east Hants and one from west Hants and the municipality of Annapolis be asked to appoint two members. That said committee have full power to appoint all sub-committees and generally to do all that is required in connection with the conducting of said exhibition and that the clerk transmit copies of this resolution to the bodies named herein.

Councillors Rescoe, Foster and Bishop were appointed as members of committee representing council.

Resolved that the committee on public buildings be authorized to make such expenditure on the exhibition buildings as will make them reasonably suitable for the purpose of holding the exhibition. Passed.

On petition to straighten road leading from the west line of lands of P. M. Brooken to Baptist church in Cornwallis it was resolved that the prayer of petition be granted and survey and alteration be made and filed. Passed.

Resolved that James Ward surveyor be instructed to re-survey the road from Wright's Bishop, Canada westerly to the Quacrauc lake as formerly laid out as this is necessary to determine the exact location of said road. Passed.

Resolved that Mr. C. J. Wolfe, paid pro rata for the time he has been employed as inspector under the Statute of this Municipality, and as by a recent decision of the court the Statute has been declared not to be in force in Kings County, it is further resolved that his appointment be revoked. -Lost.

Moved by Coun. Dickie see by Coun. Bares that the Council have a special meeting commencing the last Tuesday of June for the purpose of considering the matter of insane and poor and the better way of providing for the same in this County. - Passed.

Reports of Committee on highways returns recommending that in Ward 1 J. Hand surveyor Dist. 12, 12 days labor not performed should be collected, and that similar action be collected on all other cases where sufficient returns are not shown by the surveyor. Resolved that the same be collected. - Passed.

Petition from Jos. B. Branson asking to be allowed to perform his statute labor on his own road. Allowed. Whereas the assessors of Ward 8 have made a mistake in carrying out the assessment valuation of Alexander Jones of Grand Pre of one hundred and eighty dollars.
