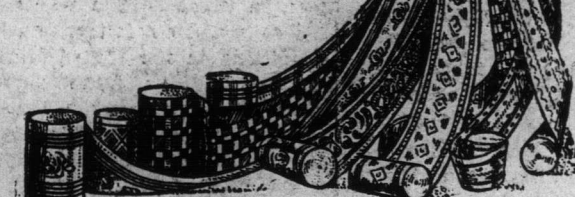

HENRY FAWCETT died 1884, aged 91. To him England owes the introduction of Postal orders, sixpenny telegrams and numerous other reforms. In 1858 he lost the use of both his eyes, but notwithstanding his blindness, he was elected M.P. for Brighton, in 1865 and was made Postmaster General in 1880, a position he held till his death.

BODLEIAN LIBRARY opened 1603. This great library in Oxford is named after Sir Thomas Bodley, who, after the complete destruction (1556) of the University library of Oxford, dating from 1409, restored it by a gift of books collected by himself at a cost of £10,000. The library has now nearly half a million volumes. It is entitled to a copy of every book printed in the United Kingdom.

Invermore Back.

The s.s. Invermore, Capt. Jacob Kean, returned from the northward at 9 o'clock last night. She brought a large freight, consisting mainly of whale oil, and quite a number of passengers. She left here on Saturday, Oct. 25th and made a good run north, calling at all her ports as far as Rigolet. On her return stormy weather prevailed, and on Sunday a heavy N.W. gale raged, with thick snow squalls. On reaching Battle Harbor Sunday in the height of the storm, it was found the ship could not enter that port, and so had to put back to Muddie's Island till the storm abated. On Monday another attempt was made, but without success, and the ship continued on south, where better weather was met as she came along. Though a very heavy sea was running as a result of the recent storm, the ship made very good time on the home stretch.
