Germany's Difficult **Game With Submarines**

It will be remembered that the Germans have been working might and main to induce the American Government to prevent American firms and citizens from supplying Britain and her allies with contraband goods. The American answer was that the American market was open to Germany and her allies, and that it would be unneutral for the American Govport of contraband. By international law, the same remedy was available to Germany as to Britain. It was open to her to search neutral ships for contraband.
