BRTIISH LAUNCH GREAT OFFNSIVE
German Trenches and Prisoners Captured Over a 20-Mile Front.
BRITISH HEADQUARTERE IN FRANCE, To-Day! A tremendous British offensive was launched at half past seven this morning over a front extending for twent miles north of the Somme. The assault was preceded by terrific bombardment. The British troops already have occupied the German front line and have captured many prisoners. A terrific bonbardment which preceded the attack lasted the whole of one hour and a half. It is too early as yet to give any particulars of the fighting, which is developing in intensity. The British casualties have so far been comparatively light,' according to official reports. The artillery bombardment of the last few days was concentrated this morning with a degree of fury and a number of guns which were unprecedented in the regionof Albert and the Somme, with the French co-operating dust hung over the whole field as far as the eye could see. Infantry sprang from the trenches for an assault over a front of twenty miles. Already it has gained possession New British mortars played a great part in cutting number of prisoners has been taken. Some of the prisoners who have been taken say the British curtains of fire prevented them from getting food for the last five days.
A British staff officer who witnessed the advance at the junction of the French and British lines said the attac was launched as though the men were on parade. TThis offensive is probably taking place east of
Amiens, where the line of battle crosses the River Somme. This river probably marks the junction of the British
and French ferces. The advance may extend northward
and affect Arras, where there is known to be a great con-
