Microbes Cleverer Than Men.

MANY INVENTIONS "CRIBBED" FROM NATURE.

Many of man's most admired ventions are simply imitations things which Nature has been doing for hundreds of thousands of years. The telephope, for example, is "cribbed" from the human ears and vocal cords. We hear sounds by means of the drum of the ear, a tightly stretched membrane which is

The telephone transmitter, the part into which you speak, is a very perfeet model of the ear. The drum is represented by the carbon disc. The ear communicates sounds to the brain by means of nerves: the transmitter sends them over the wires.

A Human Telephone

The receiver-that is, the part which you place to your eear-speaks to you in just the same way as your own vocal speak. In everyone's throat there is a pair of cords which are tightly stretched in the act of speaking. Air from the lungs is force ed past their taut edges, and causes them to vibrate in such a way as to produce sounds. In the telephoneeceiver the electric current takes the place of air; but its effect is exactly It sets up the vibrations

The camera is nothing more or less than a large model of the eye. Light passing through the lens of th eye is focused on the retina, which corresponds exactly to the ground-glass screen or the plate of the camera. Through the retina's chief use is to send on impressions to the brain, it is capable of retaining an image for some time. Light has the same offect on it as on a photographic plate. To test the truth of this you have only to look for a moment at some brightly illuminated object, and then to cast the eyes up to the white-ceiling; you will find that you can see the image of the object for quite a

Again, the idea for the mechanism of the pump, which works by means of valves so arranged that water can flow in one direction only, has been "cribbed" also. The liquid is sucked in at the intake pipe, then it is driven forward by compression, and as the valves will not allow it to flow back t must go out through the delivery pipe.
