PUBLIC NOTICE.
The attention of the public is called to the following sections of the Rules and Regulations for the Prevention of Scarlet Fever and Diphtheria:
1. In all cases of scarlet fever and diphtheria (including aphthertic or membranous croup), every medical practitioner who shall attend on such case shall immediately or within twelve hours after he has ascertained the facts of such disease, report the same in writing to the Public Health Officer, under a penalty for each offence of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars.
2. Every household, so soon as he shall become aware that any occupant of his house is suffering from scarlet fever or diphtheria, shall give notice of such disease to the Public Health Officer, under a penalty for each offence not exceeding fifty dollars.
