Mrs. Mary Walker
Died of Paralysis

Stricken Suddenly While on Visit With Her Nephew at Dunboyne.

Aylmer, May 29. — The remains of Mrs. Mary M. Walker were taken to Fort Dover today for interment. While on a visit to her nephew, Truman Smithson, of Dunboyne, Mrs. Walker was stricken with paralysis on Friday last and passed away on Tuesday night in her 73rd year.

She is survived by three sons, all of Port Dover.

The funeral of Benjamin Noble, held today from the family residence in South Dorchester to Aylmer Cemetery, was largely attended. Mr. Noble was 81 years old and was born in Lockport, N. Y. He came to Canada when one year old, settling in North Yorkmouth. Afterwards he moved to North Dorchester, and about 40 years ago moved to South Dorchester, where he resided until his death.

Besides his widow he is survived by one son, D. A. Noble, of South Dorchester, and five daughters — Mrs. S. Mahon, Strathroy; Mrs. John McVicar, Edmonston; Mrs. H. Demery and Mrs. J. A. Moore, South Dorchester, and Mrs. Munroe, of Westminster.

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Budget for Missions.
The budget for missions, which will be brought down, will amount to \$1,400,000. This seemed like an extremely large amount for the church in Canada, to raise, he said, but when it was figured out it was found that if every member of the church contributed only 10 cents a week the amount would be realized.

Dr. McCrae also spoke of the overlapping of some of the churches in the West. It was something that struck him most forcibly on his first visit to the West years ago—the waste of men and money by several congregations creating churches in one small town. This had been overcome to a large extent by the agreement of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational churches co-operating, and he hoped the other denominations would soon identify themselves with the union.
