Synopsis of Soldiers' Memorial Hall B, law

1. On the 6th day of December A. D., 1919, a bylaw was read a first and sec-ond time by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of London to authorize the issue of \$100,000 dependence to erect a building (to be known as Memorial Hall) in the City of London on lands now owned by the Corporation of the City of London or lands to be acquired by the said corporation for that purpose and it has been estimated that it will cost to acquire the necessary land (if the said building be not erected upon lands now owned by the corporation of the City of London) and to erect thereon a building (to be called Memorial Hall) in commemoration of the officers and men who have died while on active service during the died while on active service during the war with the naval or military forces of Great Britain or her Allies, the sum of \$100,000.

2. The amount of the debt or liability to be created is \$100,000.

3. The debt or liability is to be payable, according to the terms of the bylaw in thirty years from the 1st day of April, A. D., 1920. 4. The amount to be raised annually for the payment of the debt and the interest of the installment is \$6,691.69.
