MAN SUES GROCER FOR GIRL'S DEATH

Says Canned Pork and Beans Killed His Eight-Year-Old Daughter.

An action arising out of the death of an eight year old girl named Tremblay has been entered in the Superior Court by a man named J. Wilbrod Tremblay, who is suing Auguste Blouin, grocer, St. Saviour, for \$3,000 damages.

The plaintiff alleges that his young daughter ate some canned pork and beans, which were purchased from the store of defendant and subsequently died from poisoning.

OLD BATHURST ROAD READY THIS FALL

Men Are Now Rushing Work on Old Road and Expect to Finish This Fall

Work has been started in good earnest on the old Bathurst road and at the present time forty men are said to be working with road making machine and other apparatus headed for Depot Camp, the half-way point between Bathurst and Chatham. They are turning-piking the road and will make it of suitable width with cleared walks on either side. The men are making good progress and expect to get in to Depot on Saturday, and hope to reach Bass River, sixteen miles out from Bathurst this fall. The road from this on is well settled and in good condition.

The road machine is followed by the split-log-drag and the road is expected to be in condition for travel this year.

Hon. John Morissy is credited with the undertaking of the work and when completed it will be an important link in the highways of the North Shore. For motorists and others the road will be a great convenience and it is doubtful if any other more important highway could have been opened up.
