END OF THE BUDGET DEBATE

HON. MR. LAURIER AND HON. MR. FOSTER CROSS SWORDS.
Laurier Asserted that an Excess was Occasioned by the National Policy—Foster Replied That People Moved Because of Land Hunger or Labor Shortage.

OTTAWA, Feb. 28.—On Sir John Thompson making the motion which he had given notice that the Government would take Thursday for Government business, Hon. Mr. Laurier brought down a resolution, when the order paper was now filled with notices of motions and other private business, to any day being taken permanently, but suggested that in view of Sir John Thompson's early departure for England and his wish no doubt to settle up some Government business before he left, that the Government should take next Thursday and leave the question of other Thursdays in abeyance for the present. After a short discussion this was agreed to.

On the orders of the day being called, Hon. Mr. Laurier asked if it were true, as stated in the press, that an order-in-council had been passed referring the Manitoba question to the Supreme Court, and if so, whether a copy of the order-in-council would be made available to the public. He said that the order referred to was not the ordinary reference, as the Manitoba Government had requested that the minority in Manitoba be given a copy of the order-in-council.

TORONTO IS AGAIN SOLIDLY CONSERVATIVE.
As Usual No. 1 Ward Rolls Up a Tremendous Majority Against the Liberal Unionists—Mr. Tait Wants a Missionary Seat near the Don—A Heavy Vote Followed.

Dr. Ryerson, the Conservative candidate, was yesterday elected to fill the vacancy in the Ontario Legislature caused by the death of Mr. G. D. Bagnall, Liberal, and Toronto is once more a solidly Conservative. The old Liberal First Ward rolled up the magnificent plurality of 583 for Dr. Ryerson. The second, fifth and sixth wards also gave pluralities for the Conservative candidate. A surprisingly heavy vote was polled, more than 15,000 electors exercising their franchise, compared with 974 at the bye-election in April, 1902.
