PUBLIC NOTICE.

All persons, including Lessees of grazing lauds, are hereby required to take notice that the cutting of timber on the public lands without authority from the Minister of the Interior, or the Local Crown Timber Agent of Dominion Lands for the District, is forbidden by law; and all timber so cut without authority is liable to soizure and to be dealt with as the Minister of the Interior may direct.

Each settler on a homestead quarter see ion not having timber on it, may, on application to the Local Agent of Dominion Lands 1 urchase a wood lot not exceeding twenty acres in extent, at five dellars per acre.

Any person other than a homestead settler desiring permission to cut timber, must make application therefor to the Minister of the Interior, who will deal with such application according to law.

Persons who have already cut timber without authority, must pay the dues thereon to the Crown Timber Agent at his office, on or before the let May, 1885; otherwise the said timber will be confiscated under the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act.
