What then have you to complain of? or why do you fear to serve Gon with a free heart? Bow thyself without delay to the most sweet yoke of Christ, take up the light builten of the Lord upon thee, forget thy people, and thy father's house; and receive for hitle, great; for temporal, eternal things; for the vanities of this world, the most glorious kingdom of Gon, so that thou mayest be able to say truly, with the spostle Paul: "As having nothing, and possessing all things." (2 Cor. vi. 10.)

By these and such like thoughts, and by a daily meditation on the examples of the holy fathers, the mind of this priest was strengthened unto a better purpose, so that after the time of his probation, he put on the regular habit, and after the complet on of a year, professed the solema vows, where ever after, for thirty years, he lived a praise-worthy life in the order, till, in a good old age, he slept in peace.
