Whereas, doubts have arisen as to the description of articles contemplated by the terms, "Fish hooks, nets, and seine lines and twines," used in Schedule C to the Act 31 Victoria, Chapter 44, and it is expedient that the meaning of the same should be defined and declared.

His Excellency, on the recommendation of the Hon, the Minister of Customs, and under the provisions of the 4th Section of the Act 31st Victoria, Chapter 6, has been pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that the following words in Schedule C to the Act first above mentioned, viz.: Fish hooks, nets and seine, lines and twines," shall, from and after the passing of this Order, be taken to mean Fish hooks, fishing nets and seines, and fishing lines and twines, and no other—and that the Collector of Customs at any Port at which such goods shall be imported be, and he is hereby authorized before passing to a free entry of such articles to require the importer thereof to make oath to the fact that such nets, seines, lines, and twines are so imported for fishing purposes only.
