Ruling confirmed.

House again in Committee on the Bill.
(Mr. Deputy Speaker in the Chair.)

Mr. GRAHAM moved:

That further consideration of clause 4 be now postponed and that consideration of clause 2 be now resumed.

Motion negatived: Yeas, 54; nays, 95.

The CHAIRMAN: Clause 4.

Mr. KNOWLES: It is a matter of some considerable importance as to which clause we are on.

The CHAIRMAN: Clause 4, is the one that was read.

Mr. KNOWLES: I am going to try to put a suggestion to the committee as to whether we are correctly on clause 4, or not.

The CHAIRMAN: I think the hon. member is not in order. We are on clause 4.

Mr. KNOWLES: Clause 4, I think, is not the clause that the committee should direct its thoughts to at the present time, and I am going to give my reasons for making that statement. This is a point of order. My point of order is that the committee is not correctly considering clause 4. It may be possible that there are certain reasons why we should be on that clause; but I think, that if the committee will bear with me, I will be able to show why we should not be on clause 4. I can see one reason why we might be on clause 2, because clause 1 has been passed, but I submit there is no reason whatever why we should be on clause 4. The only rule I see for our guidance, apart from the fact that the right hon. Prime Minister (Mr. Borden) made a motion last evening that we should
