

## Questions

4. The Dominion of Canada has always paid the full face amount of the principal of and interest on every direct obligation issued by it, all promptly when due in the lawful currency of the country where payable at the time of payment thereof.

In the budget speech delivered in the House of Commons on February 25, 1937, the Minister of Finance, in referring to an issue of perpetual bonds, stated "it was intended as the initial step in a program which is designed to provide for the consolidation and simplification of our public debt structure. Another purpose which we had in mind was to facilitate the setting up as soon as the condition of our national finances make it practicable, of a general sinking fund to provide for the gradual amortization of our long term debt on scientific lines."

During the war period and for some years before the dominion government has been operating at a deficit and it has not been possible to provide for the paying off of indebtedness out of revenue. However, the government plans in this respect will be made known at the appropriate time.
