consideration: "I should insist on the precise meaning of words".

A Government that debases the language is as bad as one that debases the coinage. I call upon the Government to adopt as its New Year's resolution, to say what it means and mean what it says.

GOVERNMENT POLICY—REQUEST FOR PRESENTATION OF BUDGET

Right Hon. John N. Turner (Leader of the Opposition): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Prime Minister. When I was on the West Coast I read the disturbing statements of the Prime Minister and the Minister of Finance to the effect that they intend to dismantle our social programs.

Some Hon. Members: Oh, oh!

Mr. Turner (Vancouver Quadra): We are so outraged about this particular situation that I intend at three o'clock to present a motion for an emergency debate.

Some Hon. Members: Oh, oh!

Mr. Turner (Vancouver Quadra): Well, that sacred trust has now become a broken trust.

Will the Prime Minister instruct his Minister of Finance to bring down a Budget at an early opportunity so that we will know the entire scope of what the Government has in mind, who will receive old age pensions and who won't, who will receive family allowances and who won't? I believe the confusion which has now been shored up in the minds of Canadians needs to be dispelled and an early Budget brought down in the House.

Right Hon. Brian Mulroney (Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, in a letter issued on October 6, 1982, it was stated as a recommendation that "it means looking seriously at the universality of the social security programs which now have become the vested interest of the middle class rather than the needy". The author of that is the McMillan, Binch newsletter, and we reject that. We reject that philosophy. We have been defending an important proposition.

Mr. Mulroney: We stand for social justice and fairness.

Some Hon. Members: Hear, hear!

Right Hon. John N. Turner (Leader of the Opposition): Mr. Speaker, the Hon. Member for Essex-Windsor and the Hon. Member for Oshawa will be able to take care of themselves. However, I want to say to the right hon. gentleman that I am getting a little tired and annoyed—
