Senate and House of Commons "(2) Mail shall be transmitted free of postage when sent to or by

(a) the Speaker or Clerk of the Senate or House of Commons;

(b) a member of the Senate or House of Commons;

Exception

18. Subsections 17(1) and (2) apply only to mail addressed to a place in Canada and do not apply to parcel post or mail endorsed for transmission by air or to fees for registration, special delivery, insurance or other special services."

7. Statute Revision Act, S.C. 1974-75, c. 20, s. 7:

Parliamentary examination "7. (1) From time to time, during the progress of the preparation of a revision or on the conclusion thereof, or both during the progress and on the conclusion thereof, the Minister shall cause drafts of the statutes so revised to be laid for examination and approval before such Committee of the House of Commons and such Committee of the Senate, or such Committee of both Houses of Parliament, as may be designated for the purpose of the examination and approval.

Enactment of Revised Statutes (2) When drafts of all the statutes included in a revision have been examined and approved by the Committee or Committees referred to in subsection (1), the Minister shall cause to be prepared and introduced in Parliament a bill substantially in accord with the model bill set out in the schedule, or to the like effect."

8. Statutory Instruments Act, S.C. 1970-71-72, c. 38, s. 26:

Statutory instruments referred to Scrutiny Committee "26. Every statutory instrument issued, made or established after the coming into force of this Act, other than an instrument the inspection of which and the obtaining of copies of which are precluded by any regulations made pursuant to paragraph (d) of section 27, shall stand permanently referred to any Committee of the House of Commons, of the Senate or of both Houses of Parliament that may be established for the purpose of reviewing and scrutinizing statutory instruments."

9. Supreme Court Act, R.S.C. 1970, c. S-19, s. 56:

Report upon private bill or petition "56. The Court, or any two of the judges thereof, shall examine and report upon any private bill or petition for a private bill presented to the Senate or House of Commons, and referred to the Court under any rules or orders made by the Senate or House of Commons."

Tabling in Parliament "4. Every order and regulation made under this Act shall be laid before Parliament forthwith after it has been made if Parliament is then sitting, or if Parliament is not then sitting, forthwith after the commencement of the next ensuing session and if the Senate and House of Commons within the period of forty days, beginning with
