Due to pressure of work in this office, your previous request as to the distribution of \$16.00 Poppy Day Fund from Clinton, B.C., was unfortunately overlooked. I trust you will realize this was not intentional.

It is not desired that further monies be paid to the Consul-General for France, the account, so far as you and we are concerned, being closed.
