GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S CUP.

In the afternoon the Canadian squad and the 4th Durham squad, who competed in the A shift of the repository, entered upon a contest for the cup given by the Governor-General of Canada. They had to go through a special repository shift, which consisted in dismounting the 64-pounder gun from a garrison standing carriage, then taking it on a sleigh along a platform at right angles to the carriage, passing up and down a ramp about three feet at the highest point, and at the end mounting the gun on another carriage. The Durham men did the work, as usual, in a remarkably clever style, obeying the orders of their No. 1, Sergeant-Major Heale, with precision, and carrying out the movements smoothly except for a slight hitch at the finish. The Canadians, under Sergeant-Instructor Bridgeford, also went through the work well, and in good time.
