SEPTEMBER.—W. J. ALEXANDER, Matriculated in Toronto University with FIRST CLASS HONORS in Classics, Mathematics, English, History, and Geography, and obtained two Scholarships, viz.: The First for proficiency in English, French, History and Geography, and the Second "General Proficiency Scholarship."

MALCOLM McCALLUM, Matriculated in Toronto University with Honors in Mathematics.

OCTOBER.—G. O'REILLY, Matriculated in Medicine.

NOVEMBER.—N. WADDELL, Passed the Primary Examination at Osgoode Hall.

DECEMBER.—G. BEASLEY, Matriculated in Engineering.

FEBRUARY.—FRANK FITZGERALD, Matriculated in Law at Osgoode Hall, and stood FIRST in a large class.

APRIL.—W. LAVERY, Matriculated in Law at Osgoode Hall.

MAY.—FRANK GALBRAITH, Matriculated in Medicine.

JUNE.—W. J. ALEXANDER, Matriculated in London University with FIRST CLASS HONORS in all subjects, and obtained the GILCHRIST SCHOLARSHIP, valued at \$1,500 (£100 sterling per annum, tenable for three years).

According to the official statement of the Clerk of the Senate of the University of London, Mr. Alexander was surpassed by only three of the many hundred candidates from all parts of the British Empire who were examined at the same time, and he has attained a position not only higher than that reached by any previous Canadian candidate, but also higher than that attained by any Gilchrist scholar from any of the Colonies.
