FAVORITES LAND AT LOUISVILLE

Vogue Wins the Stake Feature—Panzaretta in Front in Fast Time.

LOUISVILLE, Oct. 10.—Mud runners again held sway at Churchill Downs this afternoon, but, despite the adverse track conditions, the form players had a big season; four favorites being returned winners.

The Golden Rod Selling Stakes, worth \$1250 to the winner, was the feature, and this fell to Vogue, owned by Gallaher Bros. of Lexington. She gained the verdict by a scant head over Grecian, which ran coupled with Sandstone as the Maiden-Keeble entry.

Pan Zaretta, odds-on choice for the third race, won easily, as she far outclassed her field, and she stepped the six furlongs in the mud in 1:12.
