### PARRY SOUND HAD TO CARE FOR 150 ITALIANS

Firm Wired for Fifty Men, But Three Times That Number Were Sent—Almost a Riot.

PARRY SOUND, March 13.—There was almost a riot when Italians sent here by Bryce Davidson of Toronto found that they had been deceived. The Ross-Harris Company say they instructed Davidson to send them 30 men, but that having immediately afterwards been advised of another agency sending fifty, they wired Davidson to send fifty only.

However, Davidson, it is said, sent one hundred and fifty, and it is reported here, collected from each of them \$2.00 in addition to their railway fares.

Of the men sent by Bryce Davidson, about eighty were given work and another fifteen found employment elsewhere. Messages were sent to him to either come up and take the men or send money for their return fares, but no answer was received.

Meanwhile the men demanded of the town that their fares be paid back to Toronto, saying that they had no money. This was refused, and then the men asked to be allowed to sleep in the fire hall and lock-up, and were given the privilege, the town supplying them with food. None of them were arrested, and it was only at their own request for shelter that they were given quarters in the fire hall, where boards were arranged in upper and lower bunks and blankets were furnished.

### USED THE WRONG NAME.

Leopold Scarrone's Chief Clerk is the Man Called to Court.

When Leopold Scarrone was called in police court John Venerandi, his clerk, appeared at the bar to answer a charge of having obtained \$4.75 by fraud from Robochi Antonio, 238 Chestnut-street, by fraud.

The police are looking for Bryce D. Davidson, who runs the Dominion Employment Agency, at 14 Teraulay-street. A warrant has been issued by the statement of Crampore and others that he with 55 other Italians paid that sum to Davidson and were sent to Parry Sound, where work was promised.

On arrival there the contractor, who was to take them on, denied all knowledge of any arrangement with Davidson. The men came back to the city and Davidson promised to repay the money and went out on the pretext of getting it. He hasn't been seen since.

The names of J. D. O'Donohue, Prof. Mayor of Toronto University, and Prof. Adam Shortt of Queen's University, were suggested in this connection.

Fined the Bartender. ST. CATHARINES, March 13.—In the police court this morning Magistrate Comfort fined three of the men caught in the St. Catharines Hotel bar after hours on Saturday night, \$10 each. The other six against whom summons were issued were not found by the police.

### The Minister of Power

Not so many years ago when Premier Whitney was mere leader of opposition, he uttered a sounding phrase—"Niagara power should be as free as air"—which has since caused him plenty of trouble; for that phrase, when his party took office, became in a measure a government policy, but not altogether with the government's good-will. Whereby hangs a tale. Among those present who heard this telling sentiment fall from the lips of his leader was Adam Beck of London, who, being rich, handsome, and happy in his home life, was supposed to be in politics less for occupation than for the amusement it afforded. Although it might have been thought that Adam Beck had everything heart could wish, this being gentlemanly, the favorite of drawing rooms, was hungry for political fame. He was on the lookout for a big idea to carry his ambitions, and Premier Whitney's little flourish of rhetoric supplied it. Adam Beck put the idea away in his mind for future reference, and when the time came he used it. And the time came quickly enough, for in January, 1906, the Ross government was wiped out and Whitney government took its place, when Premier Whitney formed his cabinet and Adam Beck was appointed minister without portfolio, that being deemed sufficient for a trifler who was supposed to take his politics no more seriously than his pride. As a matter of fact, he had sized Adam Beck up wrong. He was more than a social figure, a charming dinner-giver. He had, so the story goes, when young, been a jockey, and his financial and social success since then had not overlaid the man of action. He had not forgotten how to ride straight and hard for a prize that was worth striving for. The Whitney government presently got a taste of his quality. Whether it was his love of horses and his pride as a winner of many blue ribbons that suggested horse power, and whether horse power brought to mind another mighty power that had been tumbling over a precipice for ages, or whether Niagara power was the only unappropriated idea left after his colleagues had chosen their hobbies, or whether Providence finds some beneficial mischief for idle cabinet ministers' hands to do, or whether it was Premier Whitney's forgotten words ringing in his head—the fact remains that Adam Beck saw Niagara Falls, claimed it as his, and has been riding it ever since. Whether he will conquer his tremendous steed, break it to harness, and hitch it up to western Ontario to do most of the chores of a million and a quarter people at cost price, or whether he will just quit, is just a question. Adam Beck, mounted on Niagara Falls, has captured the imagination of Ontario. Somebody called him the minister of power, and the name sticks. Will he have power enough to land his hobby a winner? The doublet must go into another paragraph.

Pulling the Other Way. When Adam Beck went to mount his hobby, he didn't exactly find the horse staid but he did find the stable door wide open, and he had to argue his right to ride with three others, who claimed to have ridden and bridled Niagara Falls for their own pleasure.

These were the Canadian Niagara Power Co., with a charter to generate 100,000 horse power; the Ontario Power Co., 180,000 horse power, and the Electrical Development Co., 125,000 horse power. These franchises had all been obtained from the old government, the last of them in the teeth of a general sentiment for public ownership which the government saw fit to ignore, and was summarily punished for not long afterward. The old Ross government certainly agreed with H. C. Wells, the novelist, that Niagara Falls was not meant for a mere gaming stock, and if it had remained in public hands the people would probably have given away so much of the Falls that the water would have to be turned out for tourists at stated hours when it was not needed by the power companies. As it was, Adam Beck had 405,000 horse power pulling against him, and the cry of vested interests was loud in the land. The British investor, who lies heavy on every public man's chest in Canada, had bought the bonds of these power companies, and as Canada is a young country and will have to do a lot of borrowing, the British investor has to be cultivated. The British investor does not like public ownership. He doesn't like the idea of the good of all the people, including capitalists, found it mighty hard to do without seriously disturbing the business of the country. Enter the Powers of Darkness. Chief among the influences that may be said to be dragging the tail out of Adam Beck's horse is Toronto. Not that Toronto lacks in lip loyalty to the cause of public ownership, but that at heart Toronto is more than tender to the cause of private ownership. Only last January Toronto voted to establish an electric light plant of its own, but nothing has been done since, and so that vote may be regarded as a sword to threaten the present electric light company than as a weapon to use. If Adam Beck knows his Toronto well, he probably knows that the Electrical Development Company was the last of the Niagara power companies to be franchised by the Ross government. It was chartered to generate 125,000 horse power, to which was added later on the privilege of making it 100,000 more. When the Whitney government came in it canceled the extra 100,000. What with the spread of the public ownership idea and Adam Beck's spectacular lobby, the Electrical Development Company was in a bad way. It had sold some millions of its bonds to the English investor, and wanted to sell some millions more. At the height of the Beck agitation for Niagara power, the worthy persons who controlled the destinies of the Electrical Development Company went over to London to sell more bonds, and came back with empty hands. The British investors had heard, therefore declined to get any deeper in. Meanwhile the Ontario Power Company had made a

hoofer. All the municipalities, including Toronto, have voted that the plan is a good one, and that Adam Beck looks fine on horseback, but as for Niagara power they are no nearer to it than they were three years ago. Ontario can take a lot of Niagara power, but Adam Beck hasn't delivered any to her yet.

How the Horse Bolted. There are several reasons why the will of the people on the Niagara power question has not been carried out with neatness and despatch. It was not for lack of boldness in Adam Beck, who was willing to ride Niagara Falls to a finish. Premier Whitney and his cabinet warned Beck not to go too far, and then they reminded him that there was such a thing as joint responsibility. Beck had never heard that word before, and Niagara Falls was rearing and plunging under him, but at getting down to business they were miles away, showing the people of Ontario his plan.
