It was not for lack of boldness in Adam Beck, who was willing to ride Niagara Falls to a firish. Premier Whitney and his cable agara rams had full day comrade. Even Adam Beck, one apprehends, found the race getting out of hand. The municipalities of Ontario were quick enough at voting, but at getting down to business they were slow. The legal and geographical difficulties in getting them together were discouraging. They showed a dislike to discussing details.

Chief among the influences that may be said to be dragging the tail out of Adam Beck's horse is Toronto. Not that Toronto lacks in lip loyalty to the cause of public ownership, but that at heart Toronto is more than tender to neart Toronto is a habit with cities. Mackenzie, who is the brains of the combination, is quie thrifty, Scotch-all qualities that appeal to the British investor. When he goes

to London to borrow he always comes back with a bag full of money. He is in every good thing in Canada, and has pretty nearly a corner on street rail ways. He thinks not in continents merely, but in hemispheres, his interests being as far-flung as Mexico and Brazil. And now he talks coolly of opening up Bolivia with a railway. William Mackenzie is a self-made man. God helps those who help themselves Only last January Toronto voted to establish an electric light plant of its own, but nothing has been done since, and so that vote may be regarded rather as a sword to threaten the present electric light company than as a weapon to use. If Adam Beck knows his Toronto well, he probably knows his Toronto well, he probably knows straight as Adam Beck.
